Second Voyage - the second fleet of ships carrying British convicts and supplies to the colony at Sydney Cove in Port Jackson, Australia, in the year 1790.

Captain John Marshall spent his life at sea, learning the decks from 10 years of age. He took charge of *The Scarborough* from 1784 and captained her for the famous voyage. During this time several convicts plotted a mutiny against Marshall, however, he was aware of this plan and ensured the plotters were disciplined by chaining them to the decks below.

COLOR

Deep plum with a ruby hue.

BOUQUET

Sophisticated aromas of blackberry, plum, vanilla and violets.

PALATE

A harmonious palate of dark berry fruits complements the aromas, followed by a lingering vanillin oak finish.

FOOD MATCH

Ideally paired with slow-roasted lamb.
