Second Voyage - the second fleet of ships carrying British convicts and supplies to the colony at Sydney Cove in Port Jackson, Australia, in the year 1790.

Captain John Marshall spent his life at sea, learning the decks from 10 years of age. He took charge of *The Scarborough* from 1784 and captained her for the famous voyage. During this time several convicts plotted a mutiny against Marshall, however, he was aware of this plan and ensured the plotters were disciplined by chaining them to the decks below.

COLOR

Medium violet with a ruby hue.

BOUQUET

Sophisticated aromas of blackberry, plum and violets.

PALATE

An elegant wine with prominent dark berry fruits.

Subtle lingering oak on the finish.

FOOD MATCH

Ideally paired with grilled meats and burgers.
